

Trymalium ledifolium
var. ledifolium

LIMESTONE TRYMALIUM

Fenzl.

Flowering period: July–November.

Description: Erect and slightly spreading small shrub 0.3–1.2 m high often multibranching. Leaves of variable length 10–30 mm long green above, white below with margins rolled. Flower in axillary racemes to 40–6 mm long with numerous star-like flowers event spaced along the raceme.

Pollination: Flies and other native dipterans that may be attracted to sometimes odourous flowers.

Distribution: From Greenhead south to Dunsborough where it is restricted to limestone areas.

Propagation: Cuttings.

Uses in restoration: Only useful in protected to semi-protected limestone areas.

Notes: With a heath-like appearance and tidy foliage the species would make an attractive low shrub that would adapt well to shaping and pruning in managed garden situations.



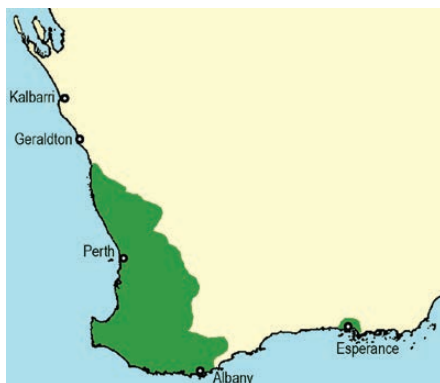
